A grade of B or better is required of all courses.

Language Requirement:

PhD students must complete a fourth semester (2020 level) or equivalent in a language with a B or better. Non-native English speakers may use their native language to fulfill this requirement. Courses and/or proficiency tests must be dated no more than six years prior to the date of application for language verification.
